### NSDAR Members Course

The Members Course candidates learn about DAR and how they can become more active members of DAR at all levels, Chapter, State and National. The course has been structured to be self-directed, so that members can fit the *Members Course* into their busy schedule of work, family and play. Participants can do the NSDAR Core Curriculum at any time of the day or night.

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### NSDAR New Horizons Course

**New Horizons candidates are Members course graduates** actively involved as leaders or interested in becoming future leaders in the operation and governance of DAR at Chapter, State, and National levels. This flexible course helps develop/improve leadership skills, builds confidence, and strengthens knowledge of all aspects of DAR beyond the Members course through a self-guided curriculum of “Key Component” training using webinars & videos and ends in an intensive self-selected Capstone Project demonstrating group leadership that contributes to and supports the work of the chapter and state.

#### Eligibility:

- Completed New Members course (prior to VanBuren Administration) or current Members Course
- Member in good standing, participating in DAR chapter meetings & activities/projects
- Contacts DAR Leadership Training State Coordinator, Allison Holland. Submits *New Horizons Participant Endorsement Chapter Nomination Form* signed by Chapter Regent or Vice Regent & 2 other chapter members (or state officers)
- Current subscriber to *American Spirit* magazine & have computer/Internet access
