WHO is needed? Each and every DAR member! The volunteer hours of all members should be recorded. The total number of service hours of the Chapter is recorded on the annual Chapter Master Report.

WHAT hours count? Any community service that speaks to the DAR motto of “God, Home and Country” and the promotion of historic preservation, education, and/or patriotism. All volunteer work in the community, in religious, or civic organizations can be recorded. Time spent on DAR chapter work, with the exception of Chapter meetings, can be counted as well. Examples include Veterans events, applications, committee duties, etc. Please check the DAR Member’s Website for the complete list.



WHEN? All volunteer activities January 1 – December 31st should be recorded. Remind members at every Chapter meeting and in all newsletters to record hours.
