In 2008-2010, a project of then State Regent Marylee Schulz was “Honoring Revolutionary War Soldiers Buried in Arkansas”. Using what information was available at that time, Mrs. Schultz challenged Arkansas DAR chapters to revisit these graves, ensure they were tended, and place a wreath on every Patriot’s grave located in Arkansas.

The discovery and marking of the graves of Revolutionary War Soldiers has been an ongoing project of Arkansas DAR. Eternal gratitude is expressed to Clara Eno who was diligent in her search for these graves in the early 1900’s. Miss Eno wrote letters, newspaper articles, and books that are housed in the Arkansas History Commission for reference.

Ann Allison Pounds, State Historian Chair during that time, compiled information and now, fast forward to 2020 and as the 2020-2022 National Defense Committee Chair, it is my intent to revitalize this project, expand it, and involve all the Chapters in this endeavor.

The attached chart combines data listing Patriots who have been reported as buried in Arkansas, nearby chapters are also noted. This list may contain some Patriots who have not yet been located and/or proven and there may be more out there not on this list. Chapters may not be able to locate all of those listed, but I hope you will try and provide feedback. Please check with the local historical society, courthouses for depositions for pensions, local libraries, or Arkansas State Archives. Old minutes and scrapbooks of DAR chapters may Patriots graves which were marked.

This project can involve other DAR committees and other entities in the community; county officials, local historical society members, and other hereditary and patriotic groups can be contacted to assist.
